Progress on the Implementation of the Compensation Fund's new Integrated Online Claims System

The Compensation Fund has embarked on the modernization journey which is aimed at improving service delivery. The eCOID project developed an integrated online claims management system called CompEasy which replaced Umehluiko.

Update on the functionalities that are available on the CompEasy system since Go Live:

1. Third Party Registration (Linking of organization)

The Third parties are now able to link themselves to the organization on CompEasy, the requirements below must be adhered to, and the final approval is done internally in the Compensation Fund.

- Proof of Residence/ Proof of business address.
- User Access form filled and Signed by the owner.
- Certified ID copy of the owner of the company.
- Certified copy of ID if you are a third party representing the above.
